The John Muir Family Award got off to a great start over Easter. 30 families have signed up to achieve the certificate which is awarded to families by the John Muir Trust.

John Muir is a great role model for us all. He was an adventurer, conservationist and early advocate for the preservation of wilderness, activist, visionary and glaciologist whose writings became a personal guide into nature for countless individuals. He co-founded Sierra Club, a prominent American conservation organization and is an inspiration to children in Scotland.
